- Cream fudge






### They have beautiful animals!

Canberra with a population of over 350 million people, it is



# The highest peak in Australia is... Mount Kosciuszko!

**Mount Kosciuszko** is the tallest mountain peak in mainland Australia at 2,228 meters. It is located in the state of New South Wales, in the southeastern part of the country. Mount Kosciuszko was named by Polish explorer Paul Strzelecki in 1840 after Polish cultural and political hero Tadeusz Kosciuszko.



#### **Aboroginal Australians**

Aboriginal people were hunters who grew no crops and did not domesticate animals (apart from the dingo), so they were directly dependent on their natural environment. They also play various types of instruments, e.g. **didgeridoo**. It consists of a long tube, without finger holes, through which the player blows. Didgeridoos are traditionally made of eucalyptus.
